**So eat some turkey on the 25th, but remember to be thankful all year.**

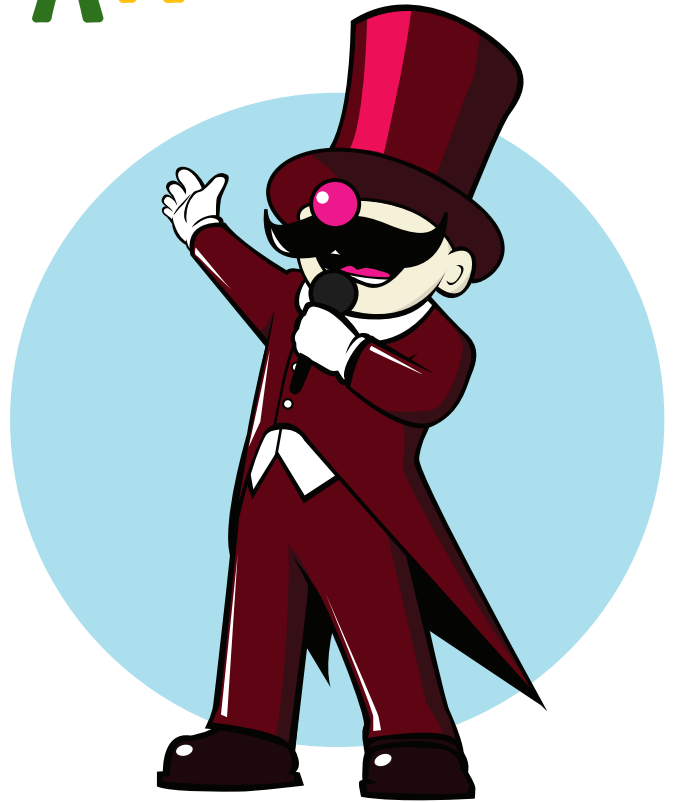


# MONOPOLY MANIA

Monopoly® was first introduced in November, 1935.

Here are some fun facts about the game.

- More than 5,120,000,000 green houses have been made since the beginning.
- The Monopoly man is named Mr. Monopoly.
- Mega games have broken world records: people have played Monopoly in a tree house (286 hours); underground (100 hours) and upside down (66 hours). But the longest game ever was 1,680 hours long – 70 DAYS!
- During World War II, compasses and escape maps were smuggled into POW camps in Germany inside Monopoly games. Real money was also mixed with the Monopoly money.
- 250 million Monopoly games have been sold and the game has been licensed in 81 countries. Toys R Us® in Bangkok introduced the Thai edition in 2005.
- Alfred Dunhill made a set with gold houses and silver hotels. Someone bought it for \$25,000.

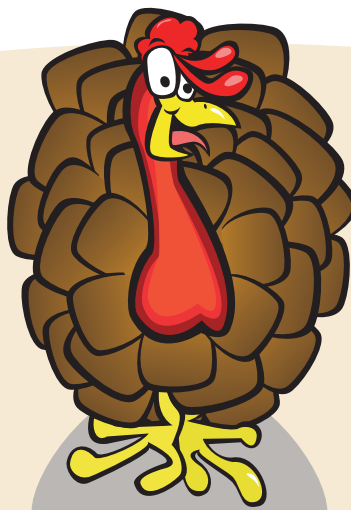


Can a turkey jump higher than the Empire State Building?

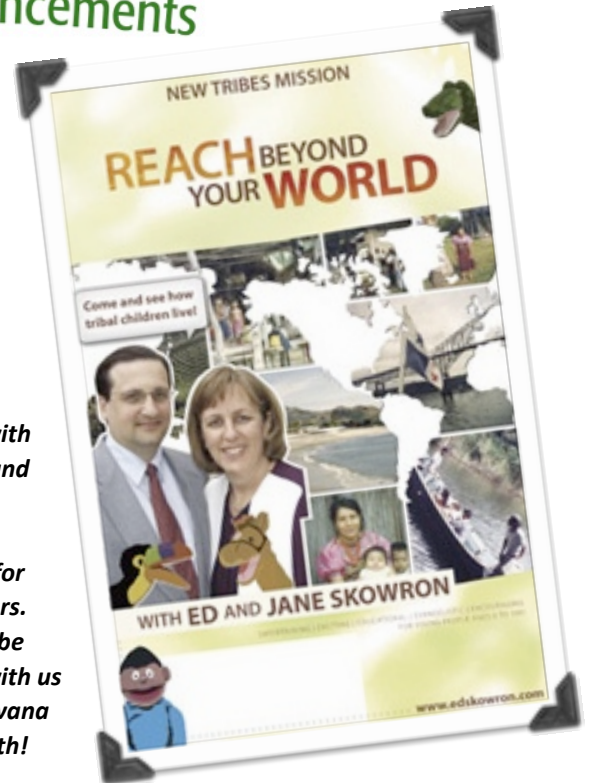
